A number of GM stations will be active with Peter GM4RAH from Beecraigs Country Park in West Lothian serving the eastern side of the central belt. In the west, the *West of Scotland Amateur Radio Society* will be operating GM7WOS on 144.275 SSB from the club shack in the Kilpatrick Hills.
